PHILOSOPHY OF MINISTRY

There are four overarching biblical principles from which all the particular ministries within the context of the church must be carried out. If a local community church is to be a biblical ministry which honors and glorifies God, while answering the real needs of His people, it must hold fast to...

1.) A High View of God

Every church, every minister, and every believer ought to strive to understand and view God as He really is, as He proclaims Himself to be in His Word (Isa 66:1-2). To view God in any way which is not in accord with the revelation of His Word, is to misrepresent Him at best, and at worst to make an idol within one's own mind. If the end state of all ministry is worship, then we must first and foremost understand Who we are to worship, and what He deems as acceptable worship, through the correct interpretation of His Word, by utilizing a consistent, literal grammatical historical hermeneutic.

2.) A Biblical View of Man

An accurate view of God consequently results in a biblical view of mankind. The closer one gets to God, the more accurately they view themselves, and see their own depravity and inability to please God in and of themselves, which brings them to repentance and a humble and willing submission to the will of God (Isa 6:1-5).

3.) A Humble Submission to the Lordship of Jesus Christ

When one sees Who God is, and who they are in light of Who God is, they are naturally drawn to Christ for salvation, because none of this is possible apart from the work of God (John 6:37-44, Rom. 10:9-10). As slaves to the Lordship of Christ, believers ought to strive to honor Him as Lord, seeking to obey all of His commands (Rom 6:16-23).

4.) A Loving Commitment to the Church of Jesus Christ

As one submits themselves to the Lordship of Christ, they should also commit themselves to serving His body, the church, and love one another, as they love Him. In doing so, one will strive to minister according to the desires and commands of Christ, and not their own desires and opinions, those of the world, a particular culture, or others (Eph. 4:1-13).

In filtering the practice of church ministry through these four principles, and the texts of Scripture which specifically address them, and each aspect of ministry, we can then develop a philosophy behind every practice and methodology of church ministry.

The Purpose of the Local Community Church

The church of Jesus Christ exists to be a pillar and support of the truth in a world full of lies, it exists to proclaim the truth of God, mankind, the universe, salvation, and everything pertaining to life and godliness. The church is to be a city set on a hill, a community of righteousness and holiness, shining as a bright light in a dark and decaying world. The local community church is to be all of this, but it is distinct from the universal church body, which consists of all believers on earth, in that it is a representative of the universal church within a specific location and community. Every believer is called to be a committed member of a local community church, in which they live out their Christian lives, striving to obey all of the LORD's commands, in order to glorify God in the specific place, time, and circumstances in which He has placed them. The exclusive purpose of the church is to be and do all things to the praise of God's glory and grace (Eph 1:6, 12). This happens as the church is used of God to glorify Himself by bringing people to Christ, redeeming them through His life, death, and resurrection, regenerating and sanctifying them through the Holy Spirit, uniting them in the body of Christ, and transforming them into His image and likeness (Col 1:28). In order to fulfill its purpose, there are three main objectives which the church must intensely pursue.

1. Exalt God

Everything that the church does must exalt and honor Jesus Christ as LORD, by proclaiming to the world that Jesus Christ is LORD not only of His church, and its individual members, but also every aspect of creation. The church exalts God by gathering to worship according to biblical commands and principles, and by living their lives in a worshipful manner (1 Cor 10:31, Eph 4:1)

2. Equip the Saints

Equipping is the primary way in which believers are sanctified and conformed into the image of Christ. This happens as each individual believer exercises their spiritual gifts according to God's designs and decrees, guided by Christ's appointed officers of His church, instructed by His Word, and empowered by the Holy Spirit (Rom 12:1-11,1 Cor 12, Eph 4:11-16, 2 Tim 3:16-17).

3. Evangelize the World

Evangelism is the faithful proclamation of the biblical gospel, irrespective of the hearer's response, or the results. When the gospel is proclaimed within the church, believers are encouraged, sanctified, and equipped to live lives worthy of the gospel, as they take that message out into the world. When the gospel is proclaimed outside of the church, unbelievers are convicted and further condemned by it, the church distinguishes itself amongst the world by it, and the elect are called out from the world, converted, and united to the church by it, all to the glory of God (Is 55:1-11, Matt 5:14-16, 28:19-20, Acts 1:8, Rom 1:16, Col 4:3).
